Savannah River Remediation Gives \$6,000 to Salvation Army, Provides Volunteers to Ring Red Kettle Bells

AIKEN, S.C. (December 8, 2010) – Savannah River Remediation LLC (SRR) has donated \$6,000 to the Salvation Army, which covers three counties – Aiken, Allendale and Barnwell counties in South Carolina. The three will share the donation by receiving \$2,000 each.

The Salvation Army, which provides numerous services to those who need help, will determine the best use of the money in their many programs.

Jim French, SRR President and Project Manager, said his company admires the good work the Salvation Army does, especially in these hard economic times.

“The Salvation Army does outstanding work each year to meet the needs of many,” French said. “Savannah River Remediation wants to reach out to help our communities and our neighbors, and this donation is a significant way we do that during the holiday season.”

In addition to the donation, SRR is providing employees who volunteer to ring the bell at the Red Kettles, seen at numerous locations across the area. The SRR volunteers are ringing bells and collecting money at the Wal-Mart on Whiskey Road in Aiken and the Wal-Mart in Barnwell.

SRR is the Savannah River Site's (SRS) Liquid Waste contractor. SRS is owned by the U.S. Department of Energy. SRR is composed of a team of companies led by URS Corp. with partners Bechtel National, CH2M Hill and Babcock & Wilcox. Critical subcontractors for the contract are AREVA, Energy Solutions and Washington Safety Management Solutions.
