

The Former Worker Medical Screening Program

The Former Worker Medical Screening Program (FWP), begun in 1993, offers medical screenings for former Department of Energy (DOE) site workers who may have been exposed to hazardous substances at work.

The medical screenings are free of charge, and available to all former DOE federal, contractor, and subcontractor employees from all DOE sites.

The medical screening includes a physical exam, blood testing, urine testing, stool testing, and a hearing test. Depending upon work history, more extensive medical tests will be conducted to identify substance exposure and occupational diseases.

External teams of health experts will review your test results and provide a written summary of your examination. Copies of all test results will be provided to you, to review with your personal physician.
